

Carm Basile is Chief Executive Officer for the Capital District Transportation Authority. CDTA is an Albany, New York-based mobility management company, with an annual operating budget of \$101 million. The company employs more than 700 people and is a mobility leader in New York's Capital Region. Their services and programs extend throughout Albany, Schenectady, Saratoga and Rensselaer counties.

Basile has worked at CDTA since 1981 and was named CEO in 2009. As CEO, Basile has company-wide responsibility for transit development, daily operations, and finances. Basile works with the CDTA Board of Directors to develop innovative strategies to deliver high-quality services, programs and facilities to the people of the Capital Region. He has led the transformation of the company into a community-based provider of mobility, increasing ridership, visibility and brand awareness. CDTA was named the Best Mid-Size Transit System in North America in October 2017. Under Basile's leadership, the organization has grown its Universal Access agreements with area colleges and businesses, increased mobility options for the Capital Region by adding on-demand service and a regional bike-share program that features more than 500 bikes at 85 stations.

Basile serves on many boards and civic organizations throughout the region. He was born and raised in Springfield, Massachusetts and graduated from Worcester State College with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Urban Studies. He lives in Latham with his wife Sheila. They have two sons.
