

## Lincoln Park Pool Rules and Regulations

- Hours of Operation: 12pm to 6:45pm daily during the summer season. Use at all other times is strictly prohibited.
- Maximum Capacity: 312
- Children under the age of 12 **MUST** be accompanied by an adult.
- Individuals with diarrhea shall not use the pool.
- Do not drink pool water.
- Children not toilet trained must wear a swim diaper covered by a swimwear.
- No animals are allowed in or near the pool.
- Pollution of the pool is prohibited, including: urination, discharge of fecal matter, spitting, or nose blowing.
- Appropriate swimwear is required; no pants or shoes are allowed in the pool.
- **No glass bottles** or containers in or near the pool.
- No food or beverage allowed in the pool area except for one (1) sealed water bottle per person.
- **Toys, snorkels, flotation devices, radios, coolers, and bags are strictly prohibited.**
- No running, horseplay, alcohol, or foul language permitted in or near the pool.
- No chairs inside the pool area.
- Listen to the lifeguards at all times; they're here for your safety.

## Lincoln Park Pool, Mater Christi Pool, and Arbor Hill Community Center Pool Residency Policy

- In order to enter and use the pool, patrons must be a resident of the City of Albany.
- Check-in at each pool requires valid photo ID and proof of residency.
- Accounts for each patron will be created using the online platform CivicREC. To create an account for you and your family members, visit this link: <https://secure.rec1.com/NY/albany-ny/catalog> Otherwise, an account will be created for you upon arrival. Note that this may take 5-10 minutes to complete.
- Once you have a CivicREC account, you may return to the pool as many times as you like, granted that you provide your valid photo ID and name at check-in. If you create an account at one location, you will not need to create an account at another location.

## Camp Requirements

- If you wish to bring a day camp or group to any of the pools, you will need to complete a Department of Health Permit and a Health and Safety Plan. Please call 518-434-5699 for more information.
